Random bits of advice

- If you don't deal well with uncertainty, starting a company might not be a great life choice.
- If you are an average software developer with average sales skills, starting a company is pretty low risk.
- Programming is a commodity. What you want to do is solve someone's (preferably a business') problems.
- Fake it 'till you make it is a reasonable strategy as long as you can deliver (or find someone who can).
- I don't like the VC path. I like bootstrapped, profitable from day one, businesses that you can explain to normal people.
- Good goal to have with bootstrapped companies is predictable acquisition of recurring revenue with annual prepay in a good market.
- Whatever it is that you are doing, make sure you care. If you care, you'll work hard, and if you work hard, good things will happen.
